Travelling by car

Car parking is free of charge; however, please note that there is a time restriction of 4 hours. Please do not park in the Volunteer Driver spaces, Staff Car Park or Disabled Bays (unless you hold a current Blue Badge).

Travelling by Ambulance or Volunteer Transport

Where possible please use your own or public transport. If you are unable to do this because of your illness you may be eligible for ambulance transport. Your doctor will discuss this with you. However, if you think you may qualify and want to arrange this service please call the following number at least 3 days before your appointment. Lines are open 8:00am to 8:00pm Monday to Saturday.

Travel Expenses

Radiotherapy Department

The radiotherapy department is on Level 0 of the Cancer Centre. You may enter the building by the Main Entrance on Level 1 or the Tom Wheldon Building on Level 0. Please check in at Reception on your arrival. **Please note** that the Tom Wheldon entrance is locked at 6:30pm each evening so exit from the building after this time is by the entrance on Level 1.

There are wheelchair bays at both entrances should you need one. If you need assistance, please ask at the reception desk.

Radiotherapy Planning and Treatment

The staff who plan and deliver your treatment are called Therapeutic Radiographers. They are registered with the Health and Care Professions Council. We have both male and female staff.

We are a teaching centre and student radiographers may be present during your planning and treatment sessions. If you would prefer not to have a student present, please let a member of staff know.

The radiotherapy department is always busy. Although we try to keep to time, this is not always possible. Staff will let you know if there is a delay and keep you informed. We ask for your patience.

Our radiographers are always happy to help so please ask if you have any questions or concerns.

Beatson Cancer Charity Wellbeing Centre

The Beatson Cancer Charity Wellbeing Centre is located on Level 4 in the Beatson. It provides a space to relax and offers various services including complementary therapies, podiatry and wig fitting/hairdressing. Patients can be accompanied by up to two visitors when visiting the centre. Ask staff members for further details.

Newsagent

There is a newsagent in Gartnavel General Hospital which also sells sundry items.

Sharing of statistical data

The NHS uses relevant information about you and your treatment to help improve cancer services. Your information is regarded as highly confidential and data protection is taken seriously. Wherever possible, information that identifies you is removed. However, on occasion personal information may be passed on to other relevant NHS bodies. If you wish to opt out of your data being shared, please ask a member of staff to contact the Head of Therapy Radiography.

Courtesy to staff

Our staff will treat you courteously and with respect. NHS Greater Glasgow and Clyde does not tolerate violence or aggression to members of staff and will consider prosecuting any person whose behaviour is unacceptable.

Smoking

Smoking is not permitted within the Centre or hospital grounds.

Please Remember

If you have any questions about any aspects of your treatment please do not hesitate to ask your doctor, nurse or radiographer.

Being diagnosed with cancer can be a distressing time for you and those closest to you. At times it can be difficult coping with treatment. Within the department we have an Information and Support Radiographer and a Clinical Psychology service available should you need further support. Please ask a member of staff to put you in touch.

There is also a Radiotherapy Advice Line if you have any questions regarding your radiotherapy treatment or side-effects of treatment after you have finished. This is an answering service, available Mon - Fri, 8.30am - 4:30pm. Please leave your contact details and we will call you back as soon as possible.

The Cancer Centre also has a Cancer Treatment Helpline for urgent calls. This is for patients on or within 6 weeks of treatment who have urgent or severe symptoms such as -

- Shivering or flu-like symptoms.
- Temperature greater than 37.5°C.
- Gum/nose bleeds or unusual bruising.
- Worsening or sudden breathlessness.
- Leg weakness/difficulty walking.
- Severe nausea/vomiting/diarrhoea/constipation.
- Sudden increased or uncontrolled pain.
- Other concerning symptoms associated with your cancer treatment.

The line is available **24 hours** for emergencies, although it would be helpful if you called early in the day if this is at all possible.

Macmillan Information and Support Centre


